She will be a joy to have on this team.

This team has worked together one day so far and it was a very busy day. It was a food distribution day and our three new members had never been here to experience the fast pace and many tasks that must happen all at once for our Saturday food distribution to move properly. After food distribution we had to help prepare Fellowship Hall for the lunch for Sandy and our church family on June 18th. We also had lunch together and then Marlene helped our new members fill out the necessary employment documents while other members of the team dug the hole for Sandy's tree. We also had to complete a few other minor tasks on our first day. It made for a busy and productive day.

This may be a young team, but so far they are enthusiastic and hard working. Marlene and I expect to get a lot done this summer with our youngest intern team ever.

Session Highlights

Session met on Wednesday, June 28th with a lovely dinner and dessert preceding the meeting. Steve Smith has been appointed by the presbytery as Moderator of Session following Sandy's retirement. Several items were decided:

- To name Wendy Lamb as the Acting Head of Staff until an Interim is in place.
- To appoint Dave Thomas, James Welte, and Rick Rodriguez as liaisons with Oak Tree Learning Center and Key Essentials to keep communication open with the church and provide periodic updates.
- To set aside all but \$2,000/month of Sandy's compensation in a custody fund until the time we have an Interim/Called Pastor. The purpose behind this is so the church does not get used to having "extra" money and then do not have the budget to pay an Interim or Called pastor. The \$2,000 will be used for pulp[it supply and to increase compensation to Wendy for her additional hours."

The main topic of discussion was the formation of a Mission Assessment Team (MAT) to prepare a Mission Assessment Plan (MAP). The purpose of the MAP is to determine where we are currently as a church and vision where we want to be. We have a long list of suggested names that might be good on this team and Session decided to appoint a small group of 4 to make some decisions and reach out to potential members. One of the goals of this team is to receive feedback from ALL members of the church so ALL voices are heard when creating this plan. You will hear about the MAT and MAP over the next several months and will have many opportunities to participate in this process.

We all acknowledged missing Sandy but agreed that the church will go on and thrive! We are so blessed to have Wendy and Steve and Session in this transitional time to lead us forward.

First Presbyterian Church of San Bernardino is a member of The Presbytery of Riverside. Ruling Elder Commissioner **Mary Bolaños** reports on the June meeting.

Report on the Assembly of Riverside Presbytery-- June 17, 2023

The Riverside Presbytery Assembly was held at Calvary Presbyterian Church in Riverside on June 17, 2023. It was moved from the originally scheduled date of June 10 due to the memorial for Kay Gustafson, Curtis Webster's wife and a respected attorney who represented our Synod and all the Presbyteries within the Synod. Curtis Webster is currently the Pastor at Westminster United Presbyterian in Ontario and we remember his service to us as interim pastor before we called Sandy.

We were welcomed by Calvary co-pastors Erin Thomas and Alfred Graise who informed us that the church would have 136 years of service as of the upcoming Monday with some current local missions being their weekly hot meal program, toiletries closet, pet supplies closet, and shower trailer.

Worship was opened with two minutes of silent reflection and led by retiring Presbytery Leader for Mission and Vision, Lee Ireland, using the text of Joshua 24 to ask us to reflect on several questions. Whom does your church serve—the wider community or the membership? Are we serving a building instead of God? In what ways are we evolving to account for the ways the world has changed and is changing? What are we going to need to let go of? Who are we going to serve going forward?

With remembrances and many (and I do mean many!) words of praise, love, and congratulations, the assembly approved three retiring servants as Honorably Retired: Teaching Elder Claire Schlegel (4/30/23), Teaching Elder Sandy Tice (6/30/23), Teaching Elder Lee Ireland (8/2/23).

Eleven(!) people were elected to terms on various Presbytery committees but chair, Amy Smith (zooming in to the meeting from Hawaii!), reported that there are still spaces on four committees: (from the report) We still have openings for several commissions/committees. Four are needed for Healthy Pastors, Healthy Congregations (HPCC), one for Committee on Representation (COR), one for Personnel, and one for Partners in Ministry (PIM). We remind all pastors and congregations that we welcome any potential names for any of our committees and commissions, especially congregants! Committee members do not need to be ordained elders, only those serving on Commissions. All meetings are held on Zoom so no travel time is involved.

In the major action of the day, our Presbytery elected a new Presbytery Leader for Mission and Vision! Frances Lin (see biography next page) is a Ruling Elder currently serving as Stated Clerk for San Diego Presbytery and is preparing for ordination in August. We welcome her and her family to our presbytery and rejoice in her answer to God's call. A brief bio follows this report.

The Partners in Ministry Committee reported that an International Peacemaker is being invited to come to Riverside Presbytery in September and the committee is asking for volunteers to help with various aspects of this visit. This will also possibly trigger a date and/or time change in the currently scheduled September 9th Assembly. PIM would also like all congregations to be aware that there is now \$210,000 available from our synod for Matthew 25 related projects with a \$15,000 maximum per project.

The Assembly declined at this time to enroll Pastor Stefanus Surjadjaja of Anugrah ICC as a Teaching Elder member of the Presbytery of Riverside, referring the action back to the Healthy Pastors & Congregations Commission for further discernment and clarification.

The Assembly was adjourned with prayer and this question: What will you be taking back from this meeting to share with your congregation?

A Brief Biography of Frances Lin

Frances Lin was born in Taiwan, raised as a Buddhist, and immigrated to the United States when she was 14. She decided to dedicate her life to Christ at age 17. Frances holds a degree in Mathematics from Indiana University, Bloomington. She also received a degree of Master in Divinity from Bethel Seminary and a Master's degree in Business Administration from the University of Phoenix. She is working on a Doctorate of Ministry degree from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. Her research focuses on adaptive leadership in the Post Pandemic Missional Movement. Frances was ordained as a Ruling Elder in 2008 and is certified ready to receive a call in 2023. She has served as the Vice Moderator of the Middle East Committee at the General Assembly 2016 in Portland and the Moderator for the Ecumenical and Interfaith Relations Committee at the General Assembly 2022 in Louisville. She is also a member of the Unification Commission tasked to unify the Office of General Assembly and Presbyterian Mission Agency. Frances had served as the Executive Director at Rancho Bernardo Community Presbyterian Church with 1400 members before COVID. She is currently serving as the Stated Clerk for San Diego Presbytery and a coach for the 1001 New Worshipping Communities initiative of PCUSA. Frances is passionate about connecting with people from different backgrounds and drafting God's story through those interactions. She enjoys playing the harp and hanging out with friends and family in her spare time.
