

In addition to the new intern team, that day we had 4 other former interns volunteer with Food Distribution without getting paid, to get community service hours. We bought food and ended the day having lunch in the library.

February 24th was our team's second day, and the team spent the day mowing the church lawns, trimming some hedges, cleaning out some rain gutters, making bags for our Tuesday food giveaway, sweeping and mopping the floor in Room 12, among other tasks. All three of our new team members learned how to do things they had never done

before, and our team leaders learned the correct way to teach someone how to do a task they had never done before with direction from their supervisors (Marlene and me). We're off to a good start!

Companions on the Inner Way Retreat Opportunity, Spring 2024

First Pres San Bernardino has a long history of supporting and attending Companions on the Inner Way Retreats. This spring, Companions once again resumes its offerings in Southern California. The last time some of our members traveled to Serra Retreat Center in Malibu California was March 2020. Soon after that the world shut down for the pandemic and although the retreats in Northern California resumed in 2022, this will be the first time we've been able to meet in person in our nearby area.

Companions on the Inner Way offers a safe communal place to explore deep longings for the Holy. Grounded in the Christian tradition, the guided retreats incorporate body, mind, and soul through presentations, dialogue, spiritual practices, art, music, movement, and worship with Eucharist. We strive to create an environment that is theologically curious, radically welcoming, and liturgically vibrant.

This year's retreat will take place from Sunday, April 14 - Friday, April 19, 2024. Its theme is 'Canticle of Creation, Mirror of God.' The retreat's brochure states that, "During the time together we'll be exploring. In the legacy of Celtic Christianity, we're reminded that the teachings of the Bible are a wee book, set beside the big book that is Creation. Yet in much of contemporary spiritual and religious practice, we've lost our connection with the earth, the living water, the voice of God in all her creatures. How do we learn to see again the face of God in all of Creation? What does it mean to touch the earth with reverence, in the midst of so much ecological distress? Can we remain open to divine wisdom as we respond to this moment in the unfolding cycle of Creation?" The presenters for this week will be Reverend Simon Ruth de Voil and Dr. Jeanette Banashak. Food Ministry Adjustments for Peak Demands

The Food Ministry continues to experience peak demands, both on the Tuesday/Thursday giveaway and on the third Saturday distribution. In January of 2023 we were averaging 33 encounters per Tuesday/Thursday; in January of 2024, that average was 88. For Saturdays, from our 2022 average of 158 participants, 2023's average grew to 217, and in January of 2024, we served 229. This is even though we have now set weekday and Saturday limits.

Increasing costs of groceries, rent, and utilities, decreases in assistance, and increased homelessness seem to be factors increasing the demand for food.

Our partnership with Community Action Partnership of San Bernardino County (CAPSBC) provides food (at no cost) for 192 families on Saturday. The remaining bags (now a maximum of 40) are provided from Feeding America of Riverside/ San Bernardino (FARSB), which is also our primary source of food for Tuesday and Thursday. Food available from FARSB has been more limited than last year and requires a maintenance fee (usually 19 cents per pound.) Your contributions enabled us to pay these fees to acquire over 100,000 lbs food from FARSB in 2023.

Daily limits help us manage costs, limited food inventories, storage spaces, and volunteer/intern resources. With our weekday limit of 70 cooking bags plus 30 non-cooking bags, we often give out all available food prior to our announced closure time. Similarly, Saturday's distribution has ended as early as 10:15 a.m.

We have been blessed with food from members and friends of the congregation, the Northgate Market (our FARSB retail partner), and through grants from the Rauch Family Foundation (\$10,000 for fresh food) and Stater Bros (\$2500 for maintenance fees and truck rental). The Rauch Family Foundation grant for "Fresh Food", has helped to balance limited FARSB's inventories, but these funds will be expended by May of 2024. The Food Ministry will continue to apply for grants, but since grant funds are unpredictable, we continue to adjust to available resources.

We are pleased to have Kristine French join Dave Thomas, Chris Thomas and me on the Deacon's Food Committee. With the regular help of Marilyn Kraft, Marlene Olivas, Margaret Doane, Frank Thomas, Sam Lange, a host of Saturday volunteers, our great staff, and others, the Food Ministry continues to provide much appreciated food to our neighbors.
