- **To seek God** whom we find in sacred text and sacrament, in music and in song, in prayer, in the beauty of this space, in the stillness where we can hear our hearts. We offer God our thanks and praise, our lament and longing, and our resources. We let go of burdens and receive grace and forgiveness. We see the One our hearts love.

God continually comes to us and that we will never be forgotten by the God whom we know is here with us in the person of Jesus Christ. In a world that so desperately needs to hear that God is right here with us, coming to us, and calling us to do justice, love mercy and walk humbly with God, it is our call as a congregation and as believers to share this Good News with the world. **The Pentecost Offering helps us live this call.** Through our giving we are able to tell the story of God, who is always there for us, coming to us. The Offering supports children at risk through the *Educate a Child, Transform the World* initiative and high schoolers attending the *Presbyterian Youth Triennium*, which shows them the inescapable loving presence of God. It also enables young adults to share Christ's light while living in

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solidarity with those on the margins of society and preparing themselves for a life of service through the *Young Adult Volunteers program.* **40% of the Pentecost Offering remains in our community, and this year will be donated to the Salvation Army's Transitional Living Center** in San Bernardino, a shelter for homeless families, and for mothers with children.

Music Box

Two of the titans in 20th century physics would be Wheeler and Feynmann. John Archibald Wheeler (1911-2008) was a theoretical physicist who worked on the hydrogen bomb at Los Alamos and later taught at Princeton. He is largely known for reviving interest in general relativity in the 1940s and 1950s. Richard Feynman (1918-1988) was a Nobel Prize-winning theoretical physicist renowned for his work in quantum mechanics, quantum electrodynamics, and the development of Feynman diagrams, as well as for his extraordinary skills in storytelling and teaching.

Wheeler was Feynmann's Ph.D. advisor. In his acceptance speech for the Nobel Prize, Feynmann told the story...

I received a telephone call one day at the graduate college at Princeton from Professor Wheeler, in which he said, "Feynman, I know why all electrons have the same charge and the same mass." "Why?" "Because, they are all the same electron!" (A rather technical conversation ensues...)

In other words, according to this 'thought experiment', there's only one electron in the entire Cosmos — it's just really busy!

The idea didn't hold up to experimental evidence, but it did open the aperture of Feynmann's imagination, leading to the theory for which he ultimately received a Nobel Prize.

So, in that spirit, I propose an analogous thought experiment: There's only One Consciousness in the Cosmos - it's just really busy! In God and each one of us.

After all, it's not that big a stretch from "We are one in the Spirit." Maybe it's like we are droplets of 'individual' consciousness in the vast Ocean that is God. No wonder Jesus teaches: "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you" — because, in this sense, you and I are indeed droplets of the same Consciousness. In this imagination, when I "do unto you" I'm doing unto myself as well!

Or, consider these teachings of Jesus: In John 10:34 he quotes the Old Testament: "Is it not written in your law, "I said, you are gods?" After all, in John 14:12 He says "Truly, truly I say to you, whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do, and greater works than these will he do..." Two verses which when I really try to think about them, my brain blows up!

I'm certainly not proposing the "Only one consciousness in the cosmos' idea as some new doctrine or dogma. It's a 'thought experiment.'

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Wheeler and Feynmann contemplating the "One Electron Cosmos" idea, even though they ultimately discarded it, still functioned as a kind of 'yeast for the imagination' – fermenting into ideas that earned Feynmann a Nobel Prize. I personally have found contemplating the "One Consciousness in the Cosmos" idea to have definitely opened the aperture of MY imagination in helpful ways. Perhaps you'll find it thought and deed provoking too. – *William Zeitler*
